#### Navigating the New Frontier: Generative Al and Academic Integrity Conference

Hosted in partnership by Mary Immaculate College, University of Limerick and Technological University of the Shannon, in association with the National Academic Integrity Network and support by the National Forum, this conference will explore the relationship between Generative AI and Academic Integrity within the Higher Education (HE) Sector.

The conference will consider ideas and debates around Generative AI including acceptable use, equity of access, originality, designing for the classroom and assessment, and policy development and implementation. It will give voice to the perspectives and experiences of academics, students, policy developers and the broader HE community.

Bringing together diverse voices, this conference will investigate how the Irish HE sector can navigate and make use of generative technologies while upholding the values of Academic Integrity. It will be of interest to academics, students, professional support staff and policy developers, and will include conference presentations, poster presentations, key note addresses and workshops.

## GenAl and History: The Good, the Bad, the Ugly Webinar

Dr Lorna Waddington (Associate Professor of International History and University Academic Lead for Academic Integrity, University of Leeds) will critically examine the integration of GenAI into history degree programmes (and the humanities more broadly), with a focus on its implications for academic integrity. Her talk touches on concerns that GenAI may erode fundamental principles of independent research and intellectual reflection that underpin academic integrity, the resilience of common forms of assessment, and the "traffic light" system used at the University of Leeds when creating assessment briefs.
