QQI Statutory Model for Awarding



How QQI Determines Award Standards

Key Policy Changes

- Restates the centrality of a learning outcomes approach
- Responds to evolution of the Common Awards
 System
- Consolidates the connection between award standards and validation recognising 'programme derived awards standards'. (PDAS)
- Seeks to promote award standards that balance learner's interests in flexible and accessible qualifications and associated pathways, while at the same time promoting system coherence, stability and consistency.

How QQI Approves Providers

Key Policy Changes

- Applies to Applicant and Relevant Providers
- Replaces policy on Initial Access to Programme Validation (IAV)
- Introduces Due Diligence checks for applicant providers
- Emphasises the centrality of 'Approved Scope of Provision'
- Clarifies rather than changes existing practice

How QQI Validates Programmes

Key Policy Changes

- Separates policy and criteria from process
- Separate policy and criteria re CAS awards removed
- Criteria retained but some re-worded for clarity
- Sub-criteria recategorized as indicators
- Programme Life Cycle and different validation processes outlined
- Clarifies rather than changes existing practice

How QQI Make Awards (Certification)

Key Policy Changes

- Specific Purpose Awards will be called Special Purpose Awards
- Offering a validated programme a pre-requisite for requesting an **award based on RPL**
- Special Purpose Awards available at NFQ levels 1 and 2
- A 'Record of Minor Awards' to replace a 'Component Certificate'
- Strengthened advice on integrity of assessment and on impartiality of decision to request certification from QQI
- Prospect of **digital format** of QQI certificates

Assessment of QQI FET Awards

- Proposed interim changes to guidelines pending planned comprehensive review (which will also encompass assessment of QQI HE awards).
- Interim revisions relatively limited but significant.
- Revisions in line with expected future direction.

Award Standards

- Assessment of learning against determined standards of knowledge, skill & competence.
- Award standards are defined with varying levels of specificity and aligned to the NFQ.
- The award standard for a named QQI FET award is the set of minimum intended programme learning outcomes (MIPLOs) and minimum intended module learning outcomes (MIMLOs) associated with the programme that leads to that award.
- Assessment criteria must relate to the standards (MIPLOs and MIMLOs).

QQI FET Awards: Assessment Techniques

- Providers **are not** obliged to use assessment techniques included Common Awards System awards specifications.
- Providers are expected to comply with the assessment strategies set out in their validated programmes.
- Any changes to assessment by providers subsequent to validation must be managed in accordance with the relevant quality assurance procedures.

QQI FET Awards: Inclusivity

- All assessment of learners should be designed from the outset to be as inclusive as practicable.
- Reasonable accommodations should be made, where required.





QQI FET Awards: Academic Integrity


- The validity and reliability of assessment are compromised when the assessment is not robust against academic malpractice.
- Guidelines more explicit about responsibilities of providers, assessors and learners in maintaining academic integrity.
- Well-designed assessment (including its governance, policy, procedures, strategy, instruments and criteria) can help promote academic integrity and prevent academic malpractice.





Computer-based Assessment


- Online/e-assessment poses particular challenges for the validity and reliability of assessment.

Draft Policy and Criteria for Provider Approval

What is the purpose of this draft policy?

This draft policy sets out the basis on which

- an education and training organisation can become a provider of QQI awards for the first time; and
- a current provider of QQI awards can be approved to extend the range of programmes it can submit for validation.

These processes have already been available but not under a single policy. This draft seeks to clarify the essential policy and criteria but does not specify details of the various approval processes as these are subject to change over time.

The policy is designed to integrate with related QQI Awards Policies on Programme Validation, Determining Standards and Making of Awards.

This draft policy will, when approved, replace policies on Initial Access to Programme Validation and Reengagement.
